- Often used with pasta, sauces, dressings, soups, seafood, vegetables, and meats
- Pairs well with other herbs including basil, coriander, and thyme



GROWING & PLANTING

- To save oregano, harvest before it reaches 4 inches and hang in a dry location
- Harvest before flowering
- Water and fertilize well



FOLKLORE & SYMBOLS

- Name comes from the Greek for "joy of the mountain"
- Used at ancient Greek and Roman weddings to crown the couple and keep sadness at bay
